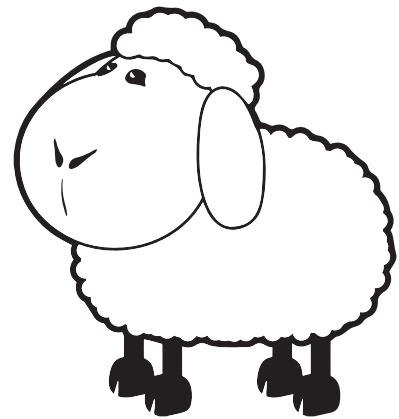

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CHAPTER 1: BIBLE STUDY QUESTIONS

Sheep need a lot of water to survive. If a shepherd does not lead them to a clean water source, the sheep will find other places to drink water such as a mud puddle. And drinking dirty water can be harmful to the sheep. Sheep need a shepherd to show them where to find clean water.

Read what Jesus said about being thirsty and drinking water.

- “If anyone thirsts, let him come to Me and drink.” (John 7:37 NKJV)
- “He who believes in Me shall never thirst.” (John 6:35 NKJV)
- “Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, For they shall be filled [satisfied].” (Matthew 5:6 NKJV)
- “Whoever drinks of this water will thirst again, but whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst. But the water that I shall give him will become in him a fountain of water springing up into everlasting life.” (John 4:13-14 NKJV).

Read that last verse again in John 4. Why do you think we will never thirst again if we drink the water that Jesus has? Is Jesus talking about actual water that we put in a cup? The answer is *no*. When Jesus talks about being thirsty, He is talking about the things we want or desire.

On the following lines, write some things that you want in this world. (Maybe it's books, toys, movies, games, a bicycle, jewelry or other things.)

Jesus is not saying that wanting things in this world is bad. The problem comes when we think we can only be satisfied with the things that we want in this world. For example, a person might say, “If I get this one thing I will be so happy and never want another thing again.” But that is never true. Jesus says we can never truly be satisfied or completely happy with things that are in this world. We will always keep wanting more and more. Another way to say it is we will keep being thirsty.

According to Jesus, what do we need to do to never be “thirsty” again?

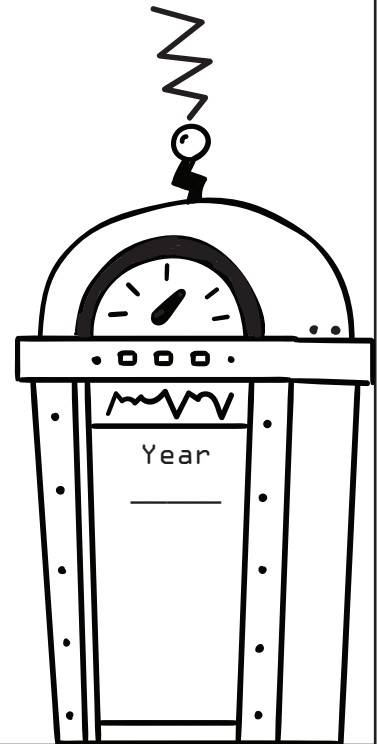
Jesus says that His “water” offers “everlasting life”. What does that mean?

We need Jesus as our Shepherd to lead us to the water that Jesus has, so we are not drinking out of mud puddles like real sheep do. To make Jesus our Shepherd, we need to listen to His voice instead of all the other “voices” in this world. This requires reading your Bible. Below, list a time of day (in your own life) that you can sit down in a quiet place and read your Bible every day. (For example: *I can get up early before school and read. I can read before I go to bed. I can read after dinner, alone in my room.*)

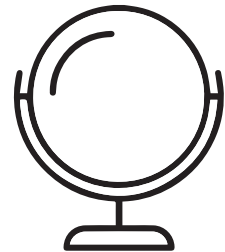

Do you think Jesus could see that the woman was sorry for what she had done? _____

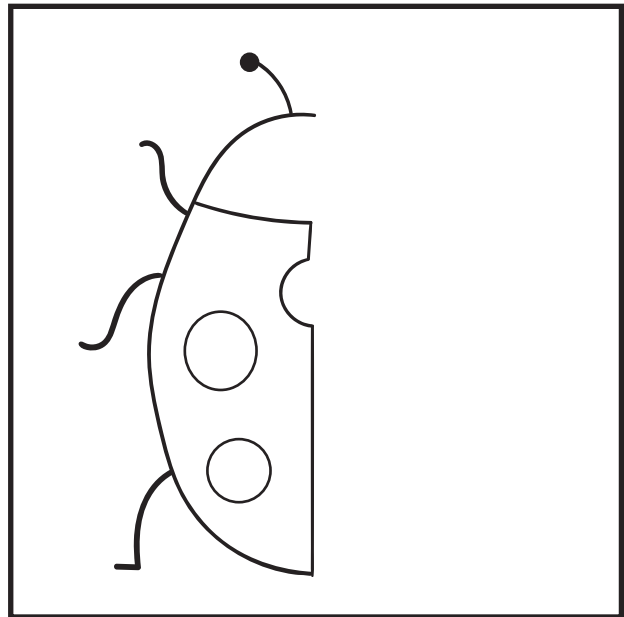
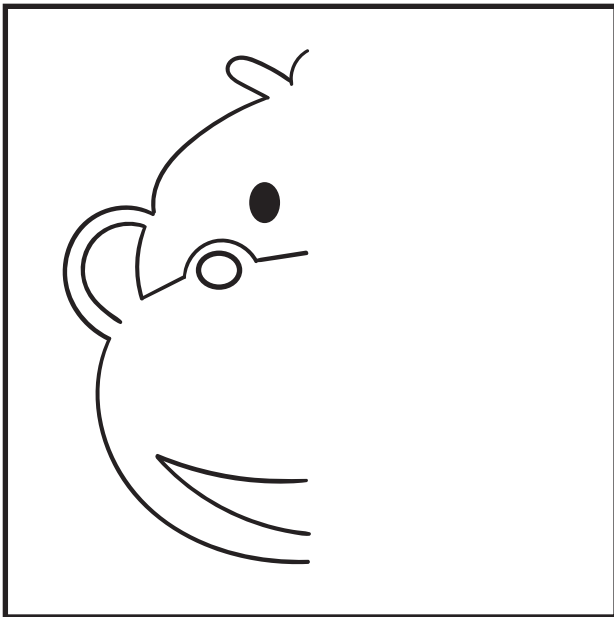
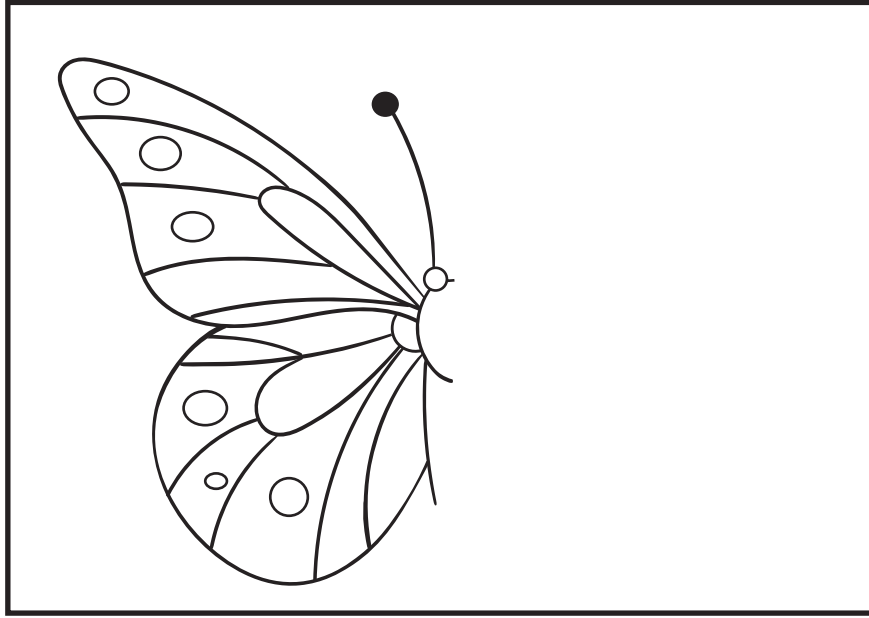
If someone does something wrong to you, should you stay upset with them and always remember the bad thing they did to you every time you see them? Or, should you look at them differently: forgive the way Jesus forgives them, and see them the way Jesus sees them?

Read Acts 3:1-10. There was a man who had not been able to walk for his entire life, and he was brought to the temple every day so he could beg for money. Many people in the city had seen him there numerous times and recognized who he was. It was likely that Peter and John had also seen the man at the temple many times before. So, what was different about this particular day that we read about in Acts 3? Why did Peter and John talk to the man on that day and not other days?

Not long before this, Jesus was raised from the dead. And in Acts 2, it says after Jesus went back to Heaven, Peter, John and the other disciples received the Holy Spirit. In other words, Peter and John now had Jesus living inside them. Jesus helped Peter and John see the man near the temple differently than they had before. If you believe in Jesus, He also lives inside you and will help you see people the way He sees them.

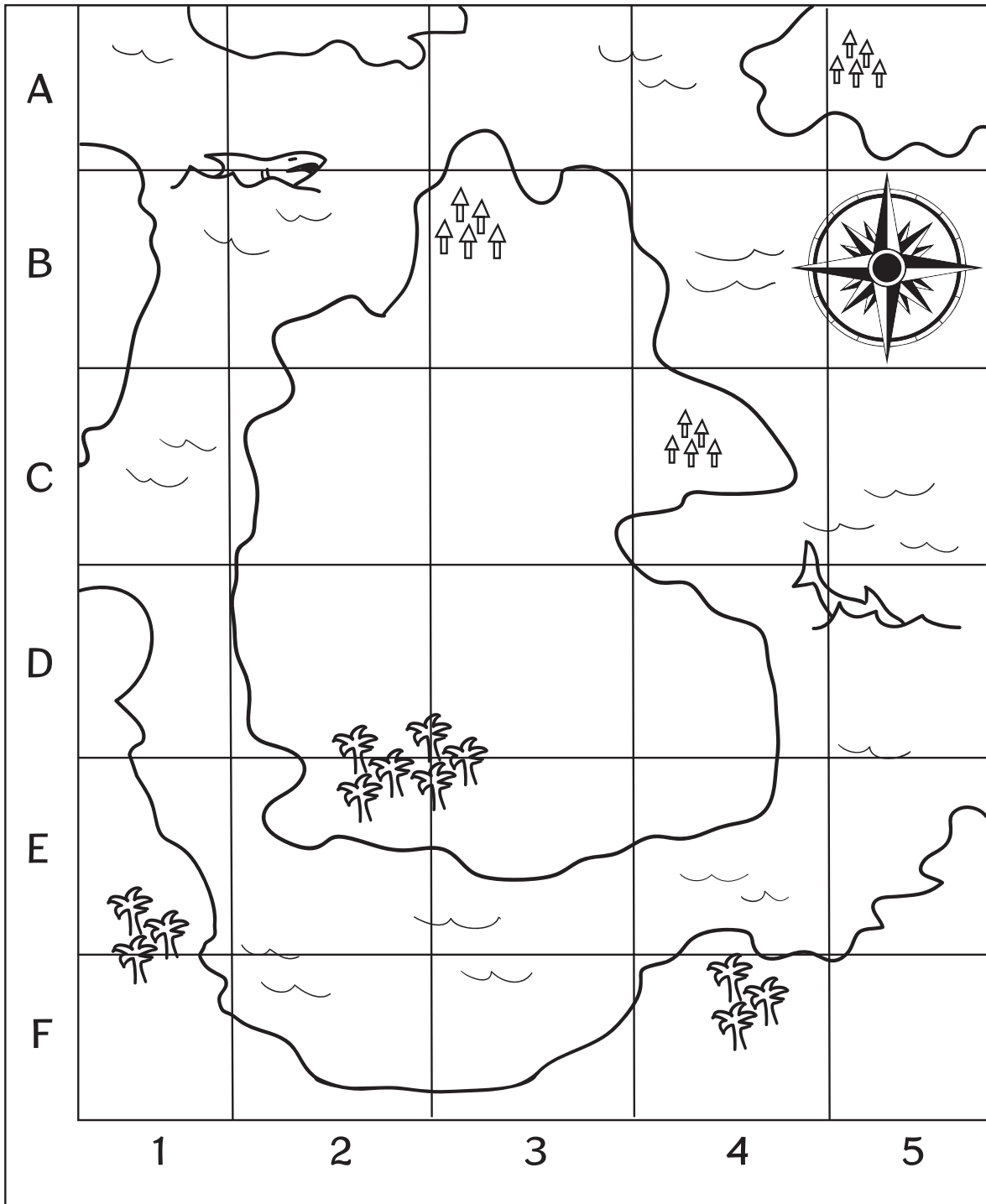
